Mainés AMAZING RACES

In Maine, we don't just build boats. We also play on them. Most all of our bays and harbors host races that range from weeknight beer-can series to multi-day drag races. Anyone with a boat and a spirit of adventure is welcome to compete for trophies or bragging rights throughout the summer months.

We've selected a few of our favorite on-the-water racing rendevous around the state, many of which are populated by boats built locally by our members.

Lobster Boat Races

A unique experience native to Maine is the annual Lobster Boat Races that span the coast from Portland to Downeast. An event that started as a fun, informal excuse for lobstermen to flex their powerful engine muscles has become a wildly popular series of races that draw crowds from around the country.

Divided into multiple classes including skiffs, gas-powered work boats, and diesel-powered work boats, these iconic lobster hulls take a day off from hauling traps to cruise around a course at speeds often upwards of 65 miles per hour.

Competitors and onlookers alike have fun comparing the advantages of different engine types paired with the perks of different hull shapes. The designers and builders of these boats are often on hand to offer their own perspectives on what makes one boat lead the pack.

Races run from June through August. More information is online at www.mainescoast.com.

GMORA Regattas

For racers who prefer to take a little more time getting around a racecourse, the Gulf of Maine Ocean Racing Association (GMORA) recognizes dozens of regattas around the state in four separate regions: Eastern, Western, Pen Bay, and Boothbay. Within each region, the races are further defined by classes of sailboats including spinnaker, non-spinnaker, multihull, and onedesign.

Using the industry-standard Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (PHRF) ratings, boats of varying models and sizes can be competitive in these regattas, regardless of waterline length

or hull desgin. That means the fastest boat around a course isn't always the firstplace finisher.

In 2023, GMORA sanctioned more than 30 regattas across the state as gualifying races to win their series trophies. Each of these regattas independently was hosted by GMORAauthorized organizers scored and bv experienced race officers. A boat is in contention by being a member in good standing of GMORA and participating in at least three of the races within its regional division.

Races take place between May and October annually. More information is online at gmora.org.

Annual Standouts

Several popular races around the state attract annual participants from near and far, as well as hundreds of onshore onlookers. These longstanding events are staples of the maritime calendars for boaters in our state.

For more than four decades, the annual **MS Harborfest** has been raising millions of dollars and regional awareness for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society. The three-day event includes a charity auction, a tugboat muster, and two days of racing.

The weekend celebrtation started in 1982 as the MS Regatta,







a long course for sailboats larger than 20 feet, which starts in Portland Harbor and winds around several small islands. Over the years the event expanded to include lobster boat racing and a tugboat muster and race. The MS Harborfest takes place each year in mid-August.

Farther up the coast, a different kind of fleet gathers annually for the **Eggemoggin Reach Regatta** and its feeder races. Sometimes considered our state's best-kept secret, this historical race has remained unchanged in its course and atmosphere since its 1985 inception.

Exclusivelv for wooden sailboats, the ERR is held on the first Saturday of August with a starting line just off WoodenBoat Harbor in Brooklin, Maine. Many of the hundred-plus entrants are classic yachts more than a century old. Others are sometimes barely a few months old, often built by one of the regatta's sponsors, Brooklin Boat Yard or Rockport Marine. The striking spectacle of so many beautiful, ageless yachts from around the world only happens here in Maine.

For yachts sailing downeast to Brooklin annually, there are two days of racing that take place before the ERR, including the Castine to Camden Regatta, and the Camden to Brooklin Regatta. More information about the ERR and its feeders is online at erregatta.com.

Some of the ERR participants are also lucky enough to qualify as entrants into another classic yacht regatta, the **Great Schooner Race** in Rockland, Maine. Considered



the largest annual gathering of traditional schooners in America, the early July regatta is organized by the Maine Windjammer Association.

With five classes of vessels based on age (pre- and post-WWI), homeport, and size, the Great Schooner Race takes passengers and onlookers back in time a century or more to an era when these traditional sailing vessels were the crux of shipping and commerce for our country. Since the 1970s in Maine, these coasting schooners have transformed into passenger vessels, cruising among Maine's thousands of islands.

Once a year, the fleet gathers together to race among these islands with more than a hundred guests on board. Interested in joining a vessel for the regatta? Go online to sailmainecoast.com.

Cruising among Maine's Islands

"You can't get there from here." It's a Maine adage that certainly holds water. Our state's stunning landscape includes thousands of islands that are all but unreachable to most landlubbers. Boaters, however, have a unique opportunity to explore pristine, protected regions only accessible by water.

Those of us boaters who live in or visit Maine have several important organizations to thank for our continued access to these islands, including Maine Coast Heritage Trust, Maine Island Trail Association, several region-specific nonprofits, as well as the networks of National and State Parks. Our appreciation is best conveyed by our use and care of these special spaces.

So, chart a course to take a hike! Explore some some farther-flug places where you can enjoy the hidden flora and fauna of our state.

FRENCHBORO

At the mouth of Blue Hill Bay sits the town of Frenchboro on Long Island, a fishing community made up of 29 residents, according to the most recent Census report. Twothirds of the island is a preserve that includes 13.5 miles of trails, winding along its 8.2-mile rocky coastline and inland through its tree-covered terrain.

Lunt's Cruise into Harbor where there are several moorings available for rent, situated among the dozen or so commercial lobster boats that are the lifeblood of the Frenchboro economy. Depending on the day of the week, you may even be able to enjoy a fresh lobster roll at Lunt's Dockside Deli or take a peek back in time in the Musuem - the only only public businesses on the island — before hitting the trails.

Just behind the Museum, pick up

the trail that leads south past two small beaches to dramatic views of the open ocean from Bluff Head.

ISLE AU HAUT

A hidden gem among Acadia National Park's trail systems sits on the "High Island," due south of Stonington and Maine's famed Merchant Row archipelego. Isle Au Haut, so named by French explorer Samuel Champlain in 1604, has a year-round population of 54. An additional 200 show up for the summer months, a tradition that has been popular since the 1800s "rusticators" began arriving from Boston and other big cities seasonally.

Isle Au Haut was made famous by lobsterwoman Linda Greenlaw who wrote the bestselling book *The Lobster Chronicles* two decades ago. Lobstering continues to be the most prevalent occupation of the island's full-time residents.

Ashore you'll find a small market

that offers basic provisions as well as some locally made delicacies and fresh-baked goods. There's even a small food truck open several days per week where you can get a hot panini or snack.

While there are no moorings available for rent, there's protected anchoring in Laundry Cove on the northwest side of the island, which is a dinghy-ride away from the town.

The tallest mountain on the island is Champlain at 543 feet of elevation, and it's actually outside of Acadia National Park. From the town landing, swing a left onto the main road and walk down about a mile, keeping your eyes open for a small trail sign tied up with a few lobster buoys — a traditional trailhead indicator in Maine.

GREAT WASS ISLAND

For cruisers who are aiming to get as far downeast as they can, Great Wass Island is one of the last land points before crossing into Canada by sea. Just southwest of the famed, sandy Great Beach on Rogue Island, Great Wass is a 1,567-acre preserve maintained by The Nature Conservancy. Part of a 43-island archipelego off the coast of Jonesport, this unspoiled land is entirely uninhabited, except by a great array of birds, reptiles, and mammals.

With several unique, natural characteristics like peat bogs



and the state's largest stand of Jack Pine, Great Wass Island is an aweinspiring ecological treasure chest. You'll discover jewels such as rare sub-arctic plants and animal species. Keep your eye out for bald eagles swooping past your boat as they shoot into the chilly water in search of dinner.

As is common for much of the Downeast. Great Wass is often shrouded in fog. Make sure you have a working radar and AIS before making the long sail to this remote region. Keep an eye on your chart as you search for an anchoring spot; there are a lot of hidden rocks along the granite coastline, and the tide swings as much as 15 feet or more.

Hole on the northern Mud side of the island is a scenic and convenient anchorage where you can pick up a hiking trail that takes vou along a 4.5-mile loop. Start down the shoreline and follow it into the Jack Pine Woodland and a bog overlook.






